The City Council met in regular session in the Municipal Building. Present on Roll Call were Mayor Amiel Redfish and Council Members: Curt Lundquist, Terry Rowbotham, Garth Johnson, Jesse Steffensen, Rob Achterberg and Cory Falconer. Absent: None.

The Mayor appointed Terry Rowbotham to serve a one-year term from Ward 1. Motion was made by Lundquist, seconded by Achterberg to approve this nomination. All in favor—Carried.

Council Members Terry Rowbotham, Rob Achterberg and Garth Johnson took their oaths of office to begin serving a new term of office as administered by Marcene Smith from Wilkinson Law Firm.

Chelsey Sheridan, Clark Engineering, met with the council on behalf of Northwestern Energy. Northwestern is in the process of installing automated meter equipment and is asking for permission to place a pole in Maxwell Park for their meter reading device. It has been proposed that the current pole be replaced with a new one for Northwestern Energy's equipment which would have a meter installed for their electric usage and that the City could place their light on the pole as well. Todd Wilkinson had sent correspondence advising the City if they choose to allow this pole that Northwestern furnishes a written agreement that describes the terms and if necessary that the pole would be subject to relocate if the City had a new public improvement—all cost associated with the project would be the responsibility of Northwestern Energy.

Motion was made by Achterberg, seconded by Johnson to approve the placement of this pole by Northwestern Energy conditional upon receiving the agreement as stated above. All in favor—Carried.

Now was the time for Public Comments—None.

Due to the fact that Becky Wendland is retiring from her teaching position at the Arlington School District after several years of service to our community—the Mayor is declaring Tuesday, May 7<sup>th</sup> as Becky Wendland day in Arlington. Motion was made by Rowbotham, seconded by Achterberg to approve this declaration. All in favor—Carried.

Travis Steffensen met with the council in order to give an update on the Field of Grace Concert which will be held on Saturday, August 17<sup>th</sup>. The concert will begin at 1:30 which is a little earlier than last year. They have five artists lined up to perform in the concert plus the activities for the kids the same as last year. The concern is the power for the music. The city advised that they would purchase a transformer to be used at the ballpark for this event so that 3-phase power will be available rather than having to use a generator this year. Travis advised that the Field of Grace will be willing to make donations to the City in order to help defray this cost over the coming years.

The council reviewed the applications for On and Off Sale Retailer Malt Beverage/SD Farm Wine Licenses for 2019-2020. The malt beverage license that is now available is the new RB (on-off sale malt beverage and on-off sale South Dakota farm wines) license. Applications on file were submitted to the City Council and on Motion by Johnson seconded by Falconer the following applications were approved with all voting Aye on Roll Call Vote—Carried.

The following building permit applications were reviewed by the council: Mike Wright to construct the shell of a 24 X 32 residence with a wraparound deck. He will be doing the work himself and since the permit is good for a one-year period—he will need to apply again to finish the inside of the structure. Mike wanted to construct this building on pillars rather than having a foundation, however; Todd Wilkinson had furnished a letter to him advising that type of structure does not comply with Arlington's zoning ordinances. Motion was made by Lundquist, seconded by Falconer to approve this building permit as long as there are 4 foot footings and a continuous foundation to support the house to be located at Lot 7, Block 2, Chandler's Addition—510 S Highland Street. All in favor—Carried. Allen Begalka presented a permit request for a single wide (72 X 15 ft 4 inch) trailer home. Todd Wilkinson had prepared a letter regarding this application as well. He states that while pylons can be utilized for structure support for the trailer—a foundation with a footing is required around the perimeter of the manufactured home. Motion was made by Rowbotham, seconded by Falconer to approve this application as long as it is installed according to the zoning ordinance. The home is to be located at Lot 11, Block 1, Miller's Addition-307 W Cottonwood Street. All in favor—Carried. The HRC submitted a building permit application for a 54 X 42 house w/attached garage to be located at Lot 5, Block 7 of C, Johnson's Addition – 107 East Hickory Street. Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Achterberg to approve this application. All in favor—Carried. Martin Murphy made application to install a 6 ft privacy fence around two sides of his deck located at Lot 11, Block 8, 2<sup>nd</sup> Railroad Addn-107 South 4<sup>th</sup> Street. Motion was made by Lundquist, seconded by Achterberg to approve this permit. All in favor—Carried.

Motion was made by Lundquist, seconded by Achterberg to approve the 2018 Annual Report as prepared by Ben Elliott. All in favor—Carried.

Marshal Mix gave the Electric Report to the council and advised that Tom Bacon had begun his employment with the City on May 1<sup>st</sup> and that he is learning the system, etc. A time will be lined up for him to meet with Jim Enga and learn our load management system and the automated readers that the City is installing.

Marshal advised the council that Rory Maynard had represented Arlington and the ACDC at the GEOD meeting in Sioux Falls. He also stated that Rory had been in contact with a company from Watertown—but no further details are available at this time.

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Achterberg to approve the Employee Overtime, Library and Police Reports. All in favor—Carried.

Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Achterberg to approve adding Preston Beck to the Fire Dept Roster and remove Dylan Carlson. All in favor—Carried.

The council reviewed the Revenue/Expense, Cash and Utility Reports.

Motion was made by Achterberg, seconded by Falconer to approve the first reading of Ordinance No. 569 which would increase the residential garbage rate per the increase received from Cook's for the increase in their cost for recycling. All in favor—Carried.

Mayor Redfish stated that nominations were open for President of the Council. Achterberg nominated Terry Rowbotham, seconded by Falconer to cast a unanimous vote for Terry Rowbotham. All in favor—Carried.

Nominations were opened for Vice-President of the Council. Steffensen nominated Garth Johnson, seconded by Achterberg to cast a unanimous vote for Garth Johnson. All in favor—Carried.

Additional items: Heartland Annual Meeting will be on Thursday, May  $9^{th}$  and there are four who will be attending. City Cleanup Day is also on May  $9^{th}$ . Other items for discussion were tabled since Todd Wilkinson was not in attendance.

Motion was made by Rowbotham, seconded by Steffensen to enter into executive session at 8:40 P.M. for contract issues, possible litigation and a personnel matter. All in favor—Carried.

Motion was made by Falconer, seconded by Achterberg to come out of executive session at 9:30 P.M. All in favor—Carried. No action taken.

Motion to adjourn was made by Lundquist, seconded by Rowbotham. All in favor—Carried.
