Motion was made by Falconer, seconded by Sundberg to adopt Resolution #2632 as follows:

RESOLUTION #2632

BE IT RESOLVED, that \$85,848 be transferred from the 2nd Penny Fund to the General Fund for payment of the bill to McMasters for gravel (\$3,858.00); Highway Improvement, Inc for crack sealing (\$13,400.00); and Road Guy Construction Co. for seal coating (\$68,590.00). All in favor—Carried.

This being the date and time advertised, motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Falconer to renew the five year On-sale operating agreement with Dakota Ram/1481 Grille that will be set to expire in July 2027. All in favor—Carried.

Gayle Wagner asked the council to furnish paint and she would gather a crew of adults to have the dugouts painted at the baseball field. The council agreed to the request.

Nancy Miklos presented the Council with a drawing of the flower bed by the park that she would like to re-do to reduce weeding. If the city will pay for the shrubs and new weed barrier, she will get it planted. The Council agreed to the request.

Annette Miller asked the Council to allow her to have a daycare in the C1 (Central Commercial) zone without it having to be registered or licensed. The Council agreed to change the zoning ordinance to say "daycare centers" (not registered or licensed daycare centers). Motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Falconer to approve the first reading of the zoning ordinance amendment. All in favor —Carried. Annette requested a special meeting (she will be responsible for payment to have the special meeting) on July 18th for the second reading of the ordinance amendment.

Annette also stated that she hired a surveyor, and they are saying the fire/tornado siren is on her property. The city will hire Banner to survey as well.

Mike & Kris Zobel met with the Council in regards to their water leak bill, and presented a counter offer. Motion was made by Rowbotham, seconded by Falconer to accept the offer made. All in favor—Carried.

After some discussion on the remaining 5 lots on Main Street the Council requested to move from Central Commercial to Residential, the Council agreed to change the 3 at the end of the street and leave the other 2 as Commercial. Motion was made by Rowbotham, seconded by Johnson to approve the second reading of Ordinance #595 as stated below. All in favor—Carried.

Ordinance #596 ADOPTING ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE ARLINGTON CITY CODE

BE IT ORDAINED by the mayor and city council of the city of Arlington, South Dakota as follows:

Section 1: Pursuant to the provisions of SDCL 9-19-16, and from and after the date of passage of this ordinance, the city code of the city of Arlington, South Dakota, contains the compilation of all ordinances of a general nature together with the changes made to said ordinances, under the direction of the governing body of the city, shall be deemed the official code and law of the city as enacted by the mayor and city council.

Section 2: The city code shall be maintained in the office of the city finance officer, certified as to correctness and available for inspection at any and all times that said office is regularly open to the public.

Section 3: All ordinances of a general nature included in this official city code shall be considered as a continuation of said ordinance provision and the fact that some provisions have been deliberately eliminated by the governing body shall not be deemed to cause any interruption in the continuous effectiveness of ordinances included in said official city code. All ordinances of a special nature, such as tax levy ordinances, bond ordinances, franchises, vacating ordinances, and annexation ordinances shall continue in full force and effect unless specifically repealed or amended by a provision of the city code. Such ordinances are not intended to be included in the official city code.

Section 4: It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to change or amend by additions or deletions, any part or portion of such code, or to insert or delete pages or portions thereof, or to alter or tamper with such code in any manner whatsoever which will cause the law of the city to be misrepresented thereby.

Section 5: Any person violating any of the provisions of the city code hereby adopted shall be subject to the general penalty provisions of the Arlington city code.

Section 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Section 7: This ordinance and the code adopted by the same shall be recorded and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
