AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1.03.01 ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE #616, AS AMENDED, OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ARLINGTON

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, an ordinance to amend Section 1.03.01 adopted by Ordinance 616, 9/11/2023, as amended, of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Arlington.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ARLINGTON, SOUTH DAKOTA: that Section 1.03.01 adopted by Ordinance 616, as amended, of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Arlington be amended to classify the following property: Lot 9, Block 23, WTL CTY Plat of Block 20-24 City of Arlington

To Agricultural (A) from General Residential (R2)

This ordinance shall become effective 20 days after the last publication of this notice, thereby repealing all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith unless a referendum is timely involved prior thereto.
